RBI Slashes Repo Rate by 50 bps; CRR Eased to Boost Liquidity

Major Announcements:

• Repo Rate Reduced:

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has slashed the repo rate by 50 basis points, bringing it down to 5.5%.
- This marks the third rate cut since February 2025, reflecting efforts to stimulate economic growth amid low inflation.

CRR Adjustment:

- The Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) will be lowered gradually by 100 basis points, reaching 3% of Net Demand and Time Liabilities (NDTL).
- Implementation schedule: 25 bps reductions on **Sept 6**, **Oct 4**, **Nov 1**, **and Nov 29**.

Impact on Economy:

For Borrowers:

- Loan interest rates, including home, auto, and business loans, are expected to fall.
- This should lead to lower EMIs, encouraging consumer spending and credit uptake.

For Savers:

 Interest on fixed deposits and savings may decline, possibly discouraging traditional household savings.

For Businesses:

 Lower borrowing costs are likely to boost capital investments and industrial expansion.

Liquidity Effects:

CRR cuts will inject around ₹2.5 lakh crore into the banking system by
 December 2025, increasing banks' capacity to lend.

• Cost Efficiency for Banks:

 Reduced reserve requirements will lower banks' operating costs and enhance profitability.

Policy Transmission:



 Easier monetary policy will be better passed on to end-users, enhancing the overall credit environment.

Macro Outlook:

- Inflation:
 - \circ Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation remains well within the RBI's target band of $4\% \pm 2\%$.
- Growth Projection:
 - o RBI maintains **real GDP growth at 6.5%** for FY 2025–26, reflecting **confidence** in India's economic fundamentals.

Strategic Outlook:

- Growth-Friendly Tilt:
 - With inflation moderating, the RBI appears to be adopting a more growthsupportive stance.
- Fiscal Synergy:
 - These steps complement government-led capital expenditure and infrastructure investments.
- Market Signal:
 - A clear pro-liquidity and pro-investment message, likely to improve investor sentiment.

Madurai Unearths 800-Year-Old Shiva Temple from Pandya Era

Cultural Importance:

- A temple dedicated to Lord Shiva has been excavated in Udampatti village, Madurai, dating back to 1217–1218 CE during the late Pandya rule.
- Known as Thennavanisvaram, the name is derived from the Pandya royal title
 "Thennavan," indicating royal patronage.

Archaeological Insights:

- Only foundation remains with stone bases on the north and south sides.
- The temple structure aligns with **Silpa Sastra** guidelines, aiding in architectural identification.
- This discovery validates earlier **1970s State Archaeology reports** suggesting ancient temples in the region.

Inscriptions & Economy:

• Two Tamil inscriptions describe:



- A waterbody sale (Nagankudi) and nearby lands by local chieftain Alagaperumal.
- o Buyer: Kangeyan alias Nambi Perambala Kuthan.
- o Price: 64 kasu (ancient coins).
- Revenue from the land was allocated to the temple, showing temple-based self-sustaining economies.

Socio-Historical Context:

- The temple was located in Attur, the earlier name for Udampatti.
- Reflects how temples served as economic and administrative hubs in medieval South India.

Conservation Efforts:

- Discovery was made accidentally by children, prompting quick intervention by locals and officials.
- Highlights need for proactive documentation of heritage sites in rural Tamil Nadu.

Shipwreck off Kerala Sparks Ecological and Economic Alarm

The Incident:

- The MSC Elsa 3, a Liberian-flagged container vessel, sank near Thotapally, Kerala on May 25, 2025.
- Carried 644 containers, including hazardous goods, 367 tonnes of fuel oil, and 64 tonnes of diesel.
- All 24 crew members were safely evacuated.

Environmental Threats:

- Oil slicks observed but no major leak reported yet.
- · Washed ashore: plastic debris, waste materials, and clothing.
- Fear over **plastic nurdles** polluting the marine ecosystem.

Fisherfolk's Plight:

- Issues go beyond the shipwreck: sand mining, pollution, sewage discharge.
- Fish sales have plummeted due to fear of contamination, despite no confirmed toxicity.
- Fishing banned within 20 nautical miles; compensation of ₹1,000/month + 6 kg rice is seen as inadequate.
- Fisher groups demand ₹10,000/month.

Market Impact:



Drastic fluctuations in fish prices:

Sardines: ₹15 → ₹300/kg

Pink perch: ₹30 → ₹190/kg

Mackerel: ₹220/kg

Response Measures:

- Cleanup led by T&T Salvage (USA).
- Oil-spill tools, tugboats, and underwater scanners deployed.
- Pollution Control Board: **no toxic pollution found yet**, but daily sampling continues.

Governance Issues:

- Shipping lanes too close (30 km vs. 50 km standard).
- Demands for:
 - o Clear container mapping
 - Salvage operations
 - Water testing and waste incentives

Broader Warning:

- Experts warn of a looming environmental collapse unless coastal governance is tightened.
- Kerala's coastline could face a "Somalia-like" crisis if current practices continue.

Elon Musk's Starlink Cleared for Satellite Internet in India

Regulatory Milestone:

- Starlink has received a licence from the **Department of Telecommunications (DoT)** to provide **satellite broadband** in India.
- Joins Eutelsat OneWeb and Jio Satellite Communications as licensed providers.

About Starlink:

 Developed by SpaceX, offers internet via LEO satellites, delivering high-speed, skybased broadband.

Rollout Plan:

- Will receive trial spectrum within 15-20 days.
- Must comply with national security and interception laws.
- Required to set up **ground infrastructure** before launch.



National Relevance:

- Enhances digital access in remote regions.
- Aligns with the **Digital India initiative**.
- Provides disaster-resilient internet solutions.

Competitive Field:

- Will compete with:
 - OneWeb (Bharti-backed)
 - Jio Satellite
 - Amazon Kuiper (awaiting approval)

Broader Implications:

- Can narrow the digital divide.
- Boosts e-governance, online education, telehealth, and IoT services.
- Raises concerns over data security due to foreign ownership.

Shah Launches 'Bharatiya Bhash<mark>a Anubha</mark>g' to Localize Governance Language

Policy Launch:

- Union Home Minister Amit Shah introduced the Bharatiya Bhasha Anubhag (BBA).
- Objective: Reduce reliance on English and promote Indian languages in governance.

Core Aims:

- Encourage official communication in regional languages.
- Develop tools for multilingual translation, especially between Hindi and regional scripts.
- Foster administrative thinking in native languages.

Budget Allocation:

• ₹56 crore allocated for infrastructure, translation software, and language tools.

Federal Language Policy:

• Communication with **Region C states** (e.g., Tamil Nadu, Kerala) still in English, but **replies may now be in the state's language** via BBA.

Cultural Significance:

- Push for national development rooted in cultural-linguistic identity.
- Seeks to restore pride in India's linguistic heritage.



Challenges Ahead:

 Need for standardized technical vocabulary, skilled translators, and training multilingual administrators.

Chenab Bridge: India's Arch Marvel Engineered for Resilience

Structural Marvel:

• The Chenab Bridge is now the world's tallest railway arch bridge, soaring 359 metres above river level.

Key Features:

- 1,315 metres long; the arch spans 467 metres.
- **Designed to remain functional** even if one pier collapses trains can operate at reduced speeds.

Construction Challenges:

- Built in **Himalayan terrain** with unstable, fissured rocks.
- Cement grouting and steel anchors used to stabilize slopes.

Disaster-Resilience:

Can withstand winds up to 220 km/h and high seismic activity.

National Importance:

- Part of Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link Project.
- Represents India's **engineering innovation in a strategic border zone**.

RBI Relaxes Lending Rules for Microfinance Institutions

Policy Change:

 RBI has reduced the qualifying asset threshold for NBFC-MFIs from 75% to 60% of total net assets (excluding intangibles).

ESTD 2022

Compliance Rules:

• If an NBFC-MFI fails to meet the 60% mark for **four quarters**, it must **submit a corrective action plan** to RBI.

Benefits to Industry:

- Allows MFIs to diversify their portfolios beyond microloans.
- Enhances financial resilience and risk management.

Developmental Impact:



- Enables MFIs to cater to broader borrower needs, especially underserved groups.
- Potential to improve service quality and product innovation.

Key Terms:

- **NBFC-MFI**: Financial firms providing small loans to low-income borrowers.
- Qualifying Assets: Loans that meet RBI's microfinance criteria.
